

1/15/1929 – 4/4/1968

King is most famous for his “I Have a Dream” speech, given in front of the Lincoln Memorial during the 1963 March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom.

“I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal.

I have a dream that one day on the red hills of Georgia the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will be able to sit down together at the table of brotherhood.

I have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a state sweltering with the heat of injustice, sweltering with the heat of oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice.

I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character. I have a dream today...”

Test Your Knowledge

1. What is the significance of the title?
2. *Hidden Figures* uncovers the story of the women whose work at NASA helped shape and define U.S. space exploration. Taken, why is their story significant to our cultural, social and scientific history?
3. The movie took place during a time in the United States when black and white people were segregated, and black people were treated unfairly.
 - a. How were Katherine, Mary, Dorothy, and their coworkers, challenged by discrimination? How did they succeed anyway?
 - b. How did the white people in the movie react to segregation?
 - c. What practices in our current day remind you of the segregation in the movie? Have you been treated unfairly because of your race and / or gender? What did you say? Would you act differently in the future?
4. What was the role of friends and family members in supporting Katherine, Dorothy, and Mary? How did they support each other? Why is having a support system important?
